SUBJECT: SUSPENSION ON PHYSICAL LEARNING

The Second Presidential address to the Nation on Friday 27th March 2021 in which all physical learning in all Universities was suspended refers.

Following the said address, the Taita Taveta University Senate held a **Special Senate Meeting on Saturday 27th March 2021** at 8.30 a.m. to consider implications of the directive on the teaching of the two groups of our students currently on Campus and resolved as follows:

1. All physical (face to face) teaching has been suspended with immediate effect until further notice.
2. The University shall remain open to the two groups of students currently in session on Campus, but all teaching shall be conducted via on line platforms. However, those students wishing to leave should:
 - a. Clear with the Dean of Students Mr. Misango for official purposes.
 - b. Those residing in TTU Hostels to clear their rooms and hand over the keys to the Dean of Students.
 - c. All those leaving **MUST** ensure they observe all COVID-19 regulations and directives including passing through lockdown counties before the curfew time of 8.00 p.m. to 4.00 a.m.
 - d. Those leaving by road **MUST** reach their home counties by 28th March 2021 8.00 p.m.
 - e. Those leaving by air or SGR **MUST** ensure to arrive in their home counties by Monday 29th March 2021 at 8.00 p.m.
3. Specific dates on arrangements for online teaching as well as the field attachment and or trips that were either ongoing or planned will be communicated by respective Deans of Schools and Chairs of Departments to affected students.

The University Management is consulting with relevant stakeholders and any further information and directions shall be officially communicated as and when necessary and available.

Meanwhile all our students, both on Campus and out of Campus are advised to continue observing strictly the COVID-19 Protocols issued by the Government, as well as TTU's internal advisories/guidelines and regulations, as has been the case.
